

CITY OF ELBERTON
WORK SESSION MEETING OF THE ELBERTON MAYOR AND COUNCIL
Tuesday, September 7, 2010 – 5:30 p.m.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof the Work Session Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Elberton convened at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, September 7, 2010, in the staff development room of the Municipal Building, 203 Elbert Street with Mayor Guest presiding.

Present were: Council Members Butler, Colquitt, Hunt, Paul and Seymour; City Manager Dunn, City Clerk Churney, Police Chief Welsh and Shane Scoggins with the Elberton Star.

Mayor Guest called the meeting to order. Council Member Paul led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance and prayer.

City Manager Dunn presented the following items for discussion relating the agenda for the regular meeting of September 13:

1. Second Reading of Ordinance 2163 to annex 103 Seaboard Street into the corporate limits of Elberton as petitioned by the owner, Tony King.
2. First Reading of Ordinance 2164 to amend the cemetery ordinance.
3. Minutes of the Elberton Planning Commission meeting of August 16, 2010.
4. Closure of a portion of the square to vehicular traffic on Sunday, September 12, 2010 at 10:45 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. for Biker Sunday Service and Bike Show sponsored by First Baptist Church and Main Street Elberton. After discussion, Council recommended leaving McIntosh Street open for traffic. Council Member Paul motioned to authorize the closing as stated above, seconded by Mayor Pro tem Seymour and the motion passed unanimously.
5. Closure of a portion of the square to vehicular traffic on Thursday, September 23, 2010 at 5:30 p.m. for the homecoming parade and pep rally sponsored by the Student Council of ECCHS.
6. Alcoholic beverage license request from Mr. Shailesh Amin of Raceway located at 883 Elbert Street. Raceway is applying for a retail license to sell beer/malt and wine.
7. Execute contract with Concerned Men of Elbert County for use of the Burke Street Gym property.

The following matters were discussion by Council and Reports from Staff:

1. Coggins Welfare has donated \$10,000 to the Elberton Police Department to purchase equipment.

2. Bids have been received for replacement vehicles for the chief investigator and animal control officer.

Any other matters that may properly come before Council:

1. Mayor Pro Tem Seymour discussed moving the regular meeting for October due to a scheduling conflict. Council recommended not moving regular meetings since the Charter required them to be on the first Monday of each month unless it was a holiday then it would fall on the following Monday. No action was taken at this time.
2. The Granite City Cook-off will be held downtown on Saturday, September 11, 2010 from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.

There being no further discussion, the work session was adjourned.
